Call for Chapters

The co-editors and the NKUA Applied Philosophy Research Lab Press invite authors to contribute to the 3rd volume of the **Hellenic-Serbian Philosophical Dialogue Series** entitled **Modernity and Contemporaneity**, that is due for publication by the end of 2021. i. Guidelines for manuspcits

Language: English. Extent: Flexible.

Format: Manuscripts should include a short abstract (150 words max), and 5-10 keywords. Authors should also provide

affiliation, (preferably, institutional) E-mail address, and ORCID iD.

Referencing: Footnotes and references should be arranged according to Chicago Manual of Style / Notes and Bibliography.

ii. Deadline

Submissions are due by October 30, 2021; no deadline extension will be given.

iii. Submission process

Manuscripts should be submitted to philosophylab@philosophy.uoa.gr with the subject heading "Modernity and Contemporaneity." Inquiries may also be directed to the same address with the same heading.

iv. Licensing, tier, copyright, indexing & abstacting

The volume will be published both in print and on-line under a Creative Commons NY-SA International License. Authors will be permitted to hold the copyright of their published manuscripts, as well as to retain unrestricted publishing rights. The volume will be assigned both on-line and print ISBNs by the National Library of Greece; the volume, as well as each chapter, will be assigned a unique CrossRef DOI, and featured in the Press' website.
